Are You the Farmer's Runt?

"The farmer had refused to consider the church because of all the hypocrites in it. One day the preacher went to buy a pig from the farmer. He asked for the runt as his pig of choice. The farmer reluctantly sold the runt but was appalled as the preacher told him, 'I'm telling all my friends this is the kind of pigs you raise!'"

I read this from an Internet post by a fellow preacher and it made me laugh. As is so often the case though, the truth of this humorous story is really sad. Sure, the church has its hypocrites just like the litter has its runt. And certainly, we don't like it when folks cast wide, sweeping judgment on the many because of the few "runts" in the litter. And it is absolutely right to point this truth out.



However, consider this ...the runt of the litter had no choice in the matter, but the hypocrite does. God's Word is filled with warnings and condemnation of hypocrites and their duplications ways. Jesus' condemnation of the Pharisees (Matthew 23) was not for their legalism but for their hypocrisy.

In the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 7) Jesus warned us concerning the act of pointing out the faults of others when we ourselves need to take a long look into the mirror of our own lives. This may be in the way we are living, the words we are speaking, or our attitude about others and ourselves. Yes, we must point out sin and error but remember what Paul by inspiration said in Galatians 6:1, "Brethren, if a man is overtaken in any trespass, you who are spiritual restore such a one *in a spirit of gentleness, considering yourself lest you also be tempted.*"

Be certain too that none of us are immune from such hypocrisy. Not the preacher, not the elders or deacons, the Bible Class teacher, not even the most faithful brother and sister warming a pew every time the door is open. Romans 12:3 says, "For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith."

Paul told Timothy, "Let no one despise your youth, but be an example to the believers in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (1 Timothy 4:12). We shouldn't give anyone good reason to look down upon us or the Lord's church!

The fact is there is little difference between the hypocrite in the church and the farmer's runt. Except that the hypocrite has a choice in the matter. Are you the farmer's runt? You don't have to be, and your soul's eternal destination hangs in the balance. You don't have to be perfect...but you do have to be obedient (Hebrews 5:8-9) and be faithful (Revelation 2:10).

Thanksgiving

The earliest documented Thanksgiving in America was in Plymouth Colony under Gov. William Bradford on July 30, 1623, in which "they set apart a solemn day of humiliation, to seek the Lord by humble and fervent prayer."

During the Revolution, having thwarted Benedict Arnold's plot, the Continental Congress proclaimed on October 18, 1780: "It is therefore recommended to the several states...a day of public thanksgiving and prayer, that all the people may assemble on that day to celebrate the praises of our Divine Benefactor; to confess our unworthiness of the least of his favors, and to offer our fervent supplications to the God of all grace...to cause the knowledge of Christianity to spread over all the earth."

When the war was won, Massachusetts Governor, John Hancock, proclaimed December 11, 1783 "to be religiously observed as a Day of Thanksgiving and Prayer, that all the People may then assemble to celebrate...that he hath been pleased to continue to us the Light of the Blessed Gospel...to cause pure Religion and Virtue to flourish...and to fill the World with his glory."

America's new President, George Washington, proclaimed a day of Thanksgiving on October 3, 1789, "that we may then unite in most humbly offering our prayers and supplications to the great Lord and Ruler of Nations, and beseech Him to pardon our national and other transgressions...to promote the knowledge and practice of the true religion and virtue."

Later, President Abraham Lincoln established the first annual day of Thanksgiving for the last Thursday of November 1863, stating: "No human counsel hath devised, nor hath any mortal hand worked out these great things. They are the gracious gifts of the most high God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy...It has seemed to me fit and proper that God should be solemnly, reverently and gratefully acknowledged, as with one heart and one voice, by the whole American people."

Thankfulness exists because God exists. Such an expression could never have evolved by chance from non -living matter. Granted, there are many who refuse to give God thanks, even though he continues to lavish blessings upon them; but, God will settle all accounts eventually. Meanwhile, giving thanks is an immanently biblical concept. "For every creature of God is good, and nothing to be refused, if it be received with thanksgiving" (1 Timothy 4:4). When we sit down to a feast this Thanksgiving (or any day), let's remember the source of all blessings. "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights" (James 1:17) ~ copied ~

Depression Due to a Crisis of Faith

David's crisis of faith came when, frustrated by unrelenting persecution from King Saul and uncertainty about his future, he decided to flee to the king of Gath in the land of the Philistines (I Samuel 27:1). There is no indication that David prayed about this decision, or that he discussed it with Abithar the priest. He was discouraged with life and depressed about what the future held in store.

How much like David we can become! When things are not going the way we hoped, when we meet with failure, when dreams are dashed, it is easy to succumb to depression due to a crisis of faith. What can we do to prevent such from happening, or how can we deal with it when it comes our way?

First, be aware that weak faith will produce spiritual depression. The real problem we face is not the unfulfilled hope but faith that is not reinforced. Faith is the victory that overcomes the world (I John 5:4).

Second, cast our anxieties to God. When we pray we are assured that He cares for us (I Peter 5:7).

Third, we need to fill our hearts with God's Word. Reading the Bible and thinking about what we are reading, will help us put our fears into focus and remind us that though we stumble, we will not fall, for the Lord will uphold us (Psalms 37:24).

Fourth, wait patiently for God to act. The psalmist said "Wait for the Lord, be strong and take heart and wait for the Lord" (Psalms 27:14).

Finally, be productive in the midst for despair or fear. Good things attempted will lift the spirit and make life worth living. Tell yourself that reaching out to help others, or sharing the gospel, or inviting others to church, will make the day a better day for yourself and others too. ~ copied ~
