What Are You Willing to Die For?

The Founding Fathers of this great nation knew well that some things were worth dying for. When they stood up against the oppressive tyranny of British despotism they were risking everything they had, including their lives. This prompted Benjamin Franklin to say, "We must hang together, gentlemen, or we will most assuredly hang separately." These men and countless others have been willing to lay down their lives for freedom.

Among all such men, Jesus of Nazareth stands as the greatest of them all. His life was lived for the soul purpose of dying. His life and his death would grant freedom to all men everywhere. He made the ultimate, supreme sacrifice for our freedom from the tyranny and repression of Satan. He paid the ultimate price so we wouldn't have too. On the cross of Calvary, he shed His blood for our sins, and reconciled us to a loving Father who wants us to be with Him in His eternal home.

While we talk of this gift being "free" (Romans 5:15-16) we have left many believing that nothing is required of them. It seems as if we have convinced ourselves of the same thing. While many have received the free gift of God's grace through Jesus they have opted to remain under the dominion of sin rather than applying the blessings of God's grace.

For the sacrifice of Christ to be beneficial to us Jesus says we must come to him (Matthew 11:28-30). This gift is not free in the sense that God does not demand something of us. Jesus said, "If ye love me, keep my commandments" (John 14:15). We are told that God, "commands all men everywhere to repent" (Acts 17:30). Jesus forewarned that if we will confess him here he would likewise confess us before the Father. However, if we deny him here he will in like manner deny us before the throne in judgment (Matthew 10:32-33). Jesus also noted that, "he that believes and is baptized shall be saved (Mark 16:16).

Pertinent to our discussion is that Christ demanded that we each take up our cross and follow him (Matthew 16:24; Mark 8:34; Luke 9:23). The idea here is that we should be willing to die to ourselves in order to be pleasing unto He who died for us. In the verses that follow this clear statement Jesus says, "For whosoever will save his life shall lose it: and whosoever will lose his life for my sake shall find it" (Matthew 16:25; Mark 8:35; Luke 9:24).

Many first century Christians, and even some today, have paid the ultimate price to prove their devotion to Christ. This is simply what Christ meant when He told the church at Smyrna to, "be faithful unto death, and I will give thee a crown of life" (Revelation 2:10). Faithfulness means being willing to die for Him who died for us.

Let us ask ourselves, "what are we willing to die for?" It has been said that the guiding principles that strengthen our society are "God, Country, and Family." I know many lives have been given for defending the freedoms we claim to cherish so much. I know there are many who have given their lives in defense of, and salvation of, the lives of their families, but what about God?

Many refuse to obey the simplest of commands; we refuse to obey, attend Bible Studies and worship, serve the church and our neighbors, study, pray, give, love, and forgive. We place personal entertainment, hobbies, temporal earthly relationships and a plethora of other excuses above doing what is right in the sight of God.

It is time for all men, especially those of us who have availed ourselves of God's gift of grace and salvation, to take stock of our lives and what is most important. Then make the necessary changes in our lives to put God first. Be Faithful!
