

DAVID L. LIPE

David L. Lipe holds an A.A. degree and third year certificate from Freed-Hardeman University; a B.A. from Harding University, an M.A. from Harding School of Theology, a Ph.D. from The University of Tennessee, and an M.S. from The University of Memphis. Lipe has been preaching since 1967 in Mississippi, Tennessee, and Alabama and been involved in mission campaigns in five foreign countries. He holds a number of gospel meetings each year and gives lectures on other occasions.

He is author of Values in Thought and Action and Religious Versus Secular Ethics—A Religious Response to Some Contemporary Secular Views of Ethics. He is co-author of the Lipe-Lewis Debate and Instrumental Music--Faith or Opinion. His 2-volume commentary in the Truth for Today Commentary Series, The Gospel of John is available for purchase from him or through Resource Publications. He has been the editor of the following lectureship books: Magnolia Bible College – 2 books; International Bible College – 1 book; Southeast Institute of Bible Studies – 7 books; Freed-Hardeman University – 22 books.

From 1990 to 2010 he was a professor of Bible and Philosophy at Freed-Hardeman University and continued to serve as the Director of the Annual Bible Lectureship through the 2015 lectureship. In 2012 Lipe became the Director of the Southeast Institute of Biblical Studies (formerly East Tennessee School of Preaching and Missions) in Knoxville, TN; he retired as director in December 2014 but continues to teach and work in fund raising and development for the school. Lipe and his wife, Linda, reside in Baxter, Tennessee; he preaches for the Cherry Creek Church of Christ in Sparta, Tennessee.

SPRING IS HERE

Dare I say it? Spring is here and officially begins this coming Saturday! In the past week or so we have laid in bed and listened to the first thunderstorm of the year along with the soothing sounds of the spring tornado sirens.

We've heard birds singing and chirping while sitting on our front porch. Colleen and I have been working around our new house and have been excited to examine all the flowers and plants beginning to bud. I've purchased an edger and a new weed eater and the thought crossed my mind that I need to get the lawn mower running. In Song of Solomon 2:11-12 we read, "For, lo, the winter is past, the rain is over and gone; the flowers appear on the earth; the time of the singing of birds is come, and the voice of the turtle is heard in our land." Okay, so I haven't heard any turtles but yes, spring is here!

So here are some thoughts as we shake off the cold days of winter:

- 1. Spring Is A Hidden Force: It is hard to believe anything in nature can live again after winter withdraws the ice and snow of its deadly hand. For you and I it may be hard to imagine that a cold, icy heart can harbor any life. But each person has a soul that cannot perish from existence. In every soul there is a hidden life that will come forth from the ground when Jesus returns "some to everlasting life, and some to shame and everlasting contempt" (Daniel 12:2).
- 2. Spring Reveals The Life-Giving Power of God: There is no other way to explain the phenomenon of springtime than the omnipotence of God. Those who claim there is no God ignore the clear and overpowering evidence that exists in creation (Romans 1:20). "The fool hath said in his heart, there is no God" (Psalm 14:1). The same remarkable power of God was seen in the resurrection of Jesus and is the only hope we have for an eternal life with Him in heaven.
- 3. **Spring Is a Type of Our Resurrection**: The same Lord who promised the yearly return of the birds, flowers, and warm summer breezes also promises a resurrection of the dead of those who die in Him (1 Thessalonians 4:14). Jesus said, "I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live" (John 11:25). The great and mighty power of God will be displayed that one last time when Jesus comes again.

I think everyone I talk to after a long winter says that they are ready for and eagerly anticipating spring. How I wish everyone had the same enthusiasm and earnest expectation for the coming of Christ. Are you ready for the eternal spring that Jesus will bring with Him on that last day? Prepare today by repenting of your sins (Luke 5:32), confessing Jesus as God's only begotten son (Matthew 10:32-33), and being baptized for the remission of all your past sins and be added to the body of Christ (Acts 2:38; 1 Peter 3:21; Acts 2:47). Then be faithful and prepared to enjoy the Son for all eternity.
