The importance of motherhood cannot be overemphasized. As English poet and writer Edward Carpenter once said, "Motherhood is, after all, woman's great and incomparable work" (*Love's Coming of age. Wom-an in Freedom*). I personally, as I know many of you alike, have been blessed by a great and godly mother who took their responsibilities seriously.

As far as I can ascertain my children represent six generations in the church. My Great-great grandparents were members of the church and my Great-grandparents were active in the church that met on Pleasant Street in Springfield, Ohio. Later they were instrumental in establishing the congregation that meets on East High Street in Springfield to this day. My grandfather served as an elder in the church in Cabot, Arkansas and his son, my Uncle Steve, has been a preacher since 1977, serving congregations in Missouri and Ohio. My grandmother had a great influence on my life and I still have letters that she wrote me years ago when I was unfaithful. In these letters I was rebuked with the love only a grandmother can exert.

About twenty years ago, while preaching for the church in Washington Court House, Ohio, my friend and brother Tim Skaggs and I took a group of young people to a youth meeting at the East High Street congregation where I had attended as a child. Following that evening's lesson, while we waited to go into the fellow-ship room, I noticed a collection of old black and white family photos hanging on the wall. The year was 1966 and there was a single picture that had a profound impact on me. It was of my mother and father, faithful members of the church, the year before I was born.

Where would I be without the godly mothers that have touched my life and shaped me to be the man I am today? I hate to think of it. From the godly women who shaped my Grandma Healea, to my dear mother, who passed into eternity over eight years ago, and who did a remarkable job raising me and my brother and sister. To the mother of my children today, sweet Colleen: I owe so much. And I know you owe a lot to the mothers who have shaped your life as well.

Retired Army General Carl Stiner, in Tom Clancy's book *Shadow Warriors* said it best. "Looking back on those days, I feel very fortunate to have been reared in a home where discipline, love, respect, and adherence to principles were the standards by which we were raised." Happy Mother's Day!

The Hand That Rocks the Cradle

This Sunday is widely heralded as "Mother's Day." The idea for a day to honor mothers is said to have been borne in 1876. Mrs. Anna Reeves Jarvis was teaching a Memorial Day lesson and thought of mothers who had lost their sons during the Civil War. It was her dream that one day there would be a Memorial Day for mothers. Then, on May 8, 1914, President Wilson declared the second Sunday in May to be Mother's Day, "for displaying the American flag and for public expression of love and reverence for the mothers of the country."

Think about the tremendous impact mothers have had throughout history. I especially remember Timothy. We call him Paul's son in the faith. But who would Timothy have been without a godly mother and grand-mother? *"When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also"* (2 Timothy 1:5)

On this day to honor mothers some will have only precious memories; memories of mothers who have gone to a grand reward. How precious are those memories! Others of us will make a feeble effort at saying "thanks" for a lifetime of care.

In all of our card buying and flower sending of the next few days, we need to be reminded of how fortunate we are if we have had God-fearing mothers. You see, the world is full of mothers who have no fear or reverence toward God; mothers who are passing those same traits to their children. Truly, "the hand that rocks the cradle is the hand that rules the world."
