I was particularly touched by the images of so many young people that I've known for many years graduate from Freed Hardeman and other colleges. Congratulations to all of our graduates! All of these things have reminded me that as a Christian there are a few things we need to always keep fresh in our minds.

- **2. Thanksgiving**: for all of the above.
- **3.** <u>Memorial</u>: For those who have gone on before and those we leave behind but most of all for the love of God and the greatest sacrifice man has known (or ever will).
