There's a Stranger at the Door

A startling knock at the door in the middle of the night awakes you. The heart pounds with surprise and anticipation. Who is it? What do they want? Has something bad happened? You decide on a course of action and prepare to defend yourself and your family. You go to the door and call out, "Who's there?" A stranger cries out with urgency. You throw open the door and the stranger tells you that your house is on fire and you must escape before it's too late. In your state of sleep, and in the commotion, you hadn't even noticed your impending doom. At this point, I do not suppose you thank the stranger and then return to bed. Do you?

Yet, this is exactly what happens to countless souls every day. Consider this...

The stranger at the door is Jesus. Christ said, "Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me" (Revelation 3:20). There are two imperatives here. One, I must hear Him. The word here means I must listen to Him and incline my ear and mind to learn from Him what He desires me to know. Secondly, I must open the door. If I am going to be saved I have to obey His voice.

The house and the deep sleep represent our lives and the world we live in outside of Christ. Consider the parable of the Lord in Matthew 12:43-45. Paul said, "For they that sleep, sleep in the night..." (1 Thessalonians 5:7). Those who are saved are "...the children of light, and the children of the day: we are not of the night, nor of darkness" (1 Thessalonians 5:5).

The fire is our unforgiven sins and the danger from that is eternal punishment. Jesus taught that those separated at judgment from the obedient and faithful would be told, "Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels" (Matthew 25:41).

The door is your heart and the knocking is the gospel of Christ. In James 1:21 we read, "Wherefore lay apart all filthiness and superfluity of naughtiness, and receive with meekness the engrafted word, which is able to save your souls." Jesus made it clear that the words which he spoke would judge us (John 12:48). David knew the importance of this and said, "Thy word have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee" (Psalm 119:11).

Now, no one would leave their family lying in sweet slumber and return to bed if they knew the house was burning down. We would not tell the stranger that to leave the house would somehow mean we did not owe our lives to him because we did it ourselves. We would do all we possibly could to follow the stranger to safety, taking our family with us. Why not obey Christ? Come out of the world and escape the danger of sin not repented of and not remitted by obedience to the gospel plan of salvation.

Take this scenario one step further...you're the stranger passing the home of a friend or loved one and realize the house is on fire. What should you do? What would you do? What will you do? Be faithful!
