Are You Suffering? Be Happy!

You have problems; you're depressed, overwhelmed, and anxious. Welcome to life. Now, I do not mean to minimize anyone's pain and suffering but the fact is we all live in a sin-cursed world and things are not always going to go like we desire. Some folks indeed seem to have more than they can bear. But, this is not true! You can bear it, maybe not alone, but with friends and family, the church, and Jesus we can! While I understand there are clinical issues many deal with, the fact is far too many people are crutch bound and wallowing in self-pity.

The answer is simple. Maybe not as simple as Bobby McFerrin's admonition, "Don't worry, be happy" (you're singing now aren't you!) but close. Look, Jesus came to give us an abundant life (John 10:10). So if you are a faithful Christian you need to stop and ask yourself these questions:

Why the long face?

Why am I so grumpy and nasty to everyone I meet?

Why do I face each day with a depressing, defeatist attitude?

Why do I consider anything other than my current situation an improvement?

Why can't I be happy right were I am?

The answers to these questions are simple.

No good reason!

Because I base my happiness on externals!

What does the Bible say about all this? Be happy when you have difficulties (James 1:2). Jesus says when persecuted and reviled we should, "Rejoice and be exceedingly glad, for great is your reward in heaven" (Matthew 5:10–12). The apostles rejoiced when they suffered shame for the name of Jesus (Acts 5:41). When the Lord refused to remove the thorn in the side of Paul He said, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness," Paul said he took, "pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong" (2 Corinthians 12:7–10). As Christians we are to rejoice and be glad when we suffer in Christ (1 Peter 4:13–16). And if we are living godly lives we are going to suffer (2 Timothy 3:12).

- Face the day with positivity! Look on the bright side. Each day is going to come with it's own unique chal lenges (Matthew 6:34). Find the good among the bad and be happy!
