
In Acts chapter eight Philip is riding along in a chariot with the Ethiopian Nobleman and along their journey Philip taught him of the things concerning the Christ. And, "...as they went on their way, they came unto a certain water: and the eunuch said, See, here is water; what doth hinder me to be baptized?" (vs. 36). To this question Philip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may. And he answered and said, I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God" (v. 37).

Some have concluded that confession is not a necessary step toward salvation because verse 37 does not appear in some ancient manuscripts. Some English Bibles place brackets around this verse, while others have demoted it to a footnote. Some have left this verse out altogether. The question is then, "is confession necessary for salvation?"

The inclusion or exclusion of this verse is really a moot point and has no bearing on the argument. What we need to do is consider the overabundance of evidence in scripture and the true definition of confession to see that it is indeed a very important and necessary step in being reconciled to God. When we consider Romans 10:9-10 it is apparent that confession is indeed a pre-requisite to salvation in Christ, for Paul says, "*That if you will confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus, and will believe in your heart that God has raised him from the dead, you shall be saved. For with the heart man believes unto righteousness; and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation.*"

This verse clearly states that an oral confession of faith precedes salvation. So, regardless of whether or not Acts 8:37 belongs in the text, the Eunuch had to have made a confession of faith in Christ prior to baptism. Since baptism is the point in which we receive salvation (Acts 2:38; Galatians 3:27; 1 Peter 3:21), and confession is made unto it, the inference is clear.

In 1 John 4:15 we read, "Whosoever shall confess that Jesus is the Son of God, God dwelleth in him, and he in God." So, without a doubt confession is indeed essential for our salvation. But confession is not solely an oral statement made prior to baptism. Jesus said, "Whosoever therefore shall confess me before men, him will I confess also before my Father which is in heaven. But whosoever shall deny me before men, him will I also deny before my Father which is in heaven" (vs. 32–33). Clearly, we must live a life of confession with our words and our actions professing our faith in Christ.
