Several years ago, I was asked to hold a Gospel Meeting at the Vale Road Church of Christ in Springfield, Ohio. This is the congregation I grew up in and in which are some who hold a special place in my heart. It was a great honor for me to be there and preach God's Word after being away for so many years. About two months ago we went back to say goodbye and memorialize my grand-mother who passed away at the age of 96. I realized something rather profound from both of these events. Prior to leaving both times, several folks had asked where it was that I was going and I replied, "I'm going home."

What I realized was that this statement was not accurate. I wasn't "going home" I was going back to where I grew up. There is an old adage, "Home is where you hang your hat." For me, physically, that is here in Northeast Mississippi with my wife and spiritual family here in New Albany. But we need to also consider that where we hang our physical hat is only temporary. We sing the hymn, "This world is not my home I'm just passing through, my treasures are laid up somewhere beyond the blue. The angels beckon me from Heaven's open door and I can't feel at home in this world anymore." I wonder... do we really mean it?

The Hebrew writer said of those great faithful men of old, "These all died in faith, not having received the promises, but having seen them afar off were assured of them, embraced them and confessed that they were strangers and pilgrims on the earth" (Hebrews 11:13). Do we consider heaven to be our home? Do we see ourselves as simply strangers and pilgrims here on earth?

Here is how you judge yourself regarding this principle... where is your heart? There is another adage, "Home is where the heart is." And this is a true biblical principle. Jesus said, "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal; but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:19-21).

Whether we like it or not we need to face the reality that this world is only temporary and that we will spend eternity somewhere. God loved us enough to send His Son to die for us so that we might be reconciled to Him and be prepared to live with Him in His home. He even inspired Peter to say, "Beloved, I beg you as sojourners and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts which war against the soul," (1 Peter 2:11).

Where is your heart today? Where is your hope? Where is your home? Be faithful!
