Goodness Is Not Good Enough

In Matthew chapter 25 Jesus tells us a parable, describing the kingdom, using ten virgins to illustrate our need to be prepared. In verse two he states that, "*five of them were wise, and five were foolish.*" We should want to live our lives in such a manner as to have Christ recognize us as being wise, shouldn't we? Then let us learn some things from the five foolish virgins and make the necessary applications to our lives.

First, one can be formal in his service to God without being righteous. The condemnation of Christ toward the scribes and the Pharisees was not because of "legalism" but hypocrisy. God never condemns adherence to his will, in fact he demands it (Hebrews 5:8-9; John 14:15). What God condemns is saying and not doing (Matthew 23:3). Jesus said they forgot to combine their service with the proper spirit (Matthew 23:23). To render worship and service to God without the proper heart will lead to God's condemnation.

Secondly, notice that these women were pure. They were of good moral character and suitable for marriage. But morality alone will not make one wise in the eyes of the Lord. This world is filled with good, moral people who will be lost for eternity because they didn't find it necessary to pursue godliness. Paul wrote that Christians ought to exercise themselves and follow after godliness (1 Timothy 4:7; 6:11). It is through the Word that we learn how we ought to live godly in this world (Titus 2:11-12). To follow the world's standard for goodness and morality without searching to live godly according to His will is foolish.

I once heard of a flyer that was announcing the coming of a man to a local fair who could quote the entire Bible. One might think that such a man would certainly be a Christian. But, I have known many men who knew what the Bible said and had great knowledge but failed in their obedience. Unfortunately, there are many who have, even in the Church, a great knowledge of God's Word, but fail in making a proper application. If one fails to be diligent in searching the scriptures and making application he will certainly be called a fool by God.

Lastly, let us be aware that enthusiasm is a foolish man's road to destruction while the wise man will follow the path of persistence. Now I am not saying that we shouldn't be zealous about our Christian lives, we should! But enthusiasm will wane at times and it is persistence that will make us wise when we stand before God in judgment. So, we must ask ourselves have we been persistent in our Christianity?

Now, let's take a moment and consider where we stand with God right now. Is there a need to repent and serve God with a proper heart? Should we be converted again and seek godliness and not merely goodness? Do I need to begin applying God's Word to my life in humble obedience? Have I relied on enthusiasm and not persistence to get me through? If my life ended today would God see me as wise or foolish? God loves you and wants you to make the right decision.



Dooley noted
