

"A Little Neglect May Breed Great Mischief"

THE END OF NEGLIGENCE—James 4:17

These were the words of warning from Poor Richard. He went on to show how im-portant it is to take care of matters and meet needs in a timely fashion. He gave a brief sce-nario showing how neglect can cause ruin: "For want of a nail the shoe was lost; for want of a shoe the horse was lost; and for want of a horse the rider was lost; being overtaken and slain by the enemy; all for want of a little care about a horseshoe nail!"

No doubt you have noticed how rapidly a house goes to ruin almost immediately after the occupants move from the premises and it is left unoccupied. My observation has been over the past five decades that hearts and lives are the same. There was a concert violinist who was asked how she became so skilled, she replied, "It was planned neglect." She planned to neglect anything that was not related to her goal. It might be well for all of us to exercise a little planned neglect. That merely means making time for things of God but ne-glecting other things that we know can harm us spiritually.

It would appear that avoidance of neglect is closely related to exercising discipline. We make choices and our choices make us. Everyone is always looking for the shortcut. We want to lose weight but don't want to modify our eating or by all means we don't want to exercise. Success in anything can only come when we turn away from that which would hurt us spiritually and embrace what would help us. It is cutting free from anything that would slow us down and get a grasp of anything that would speed up our progress. Paul ex-plained this theory to young Timothy, "Flee also youthful lusts; but pursue righteousness, faith, love, peace with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart" (2 Tim. 2:22). When we feel as though we have somehow arrived—or have somewhat reached a plateau where we don't need to practice the Christian basics anymore—it the moment that we enter a spiritual dan-ger zone. We must give the more earnest heed to the things we have learned lest we drift away! (Heb. 2:1). A legitimate question was asked, "How can we escape if we neglect so great a salvation?" (Heb. 2:3).

We might ask, "Is our mind stayed on God or is it starved?" Starvation of the mind is caused by neglect and is one of the chief sources of exhaustion and weakness in a servant's life. We must strive to "bring every thought into captivity to the obedience of Christ..." (2 Cor. 10:5). Our thoughts when developed properly come from God and our minds will not be at the mercy of our impulsive thinking, but will always be used in service to God.
